Project Title Building an Equitable Enterprenurial Ecosystem

Project Description (Add pages, if needed)

The Bay Area Community College Consortium in partnership with ESO Ventures and Workforce Innovation Labs launched the Building an Equitable Entrepreneurial Ecosystem program. Five community colleges participated in the program last year (2023-24): Canada College, Contra Costa College, Diablo Valley College, Merritt College, & West Valley College. They trained 206 entrepreneurs. 23 of these entrepreneurs were awarded a low-interest loan. SRJC and College of Marin were invited to participate this year (2024-25). Each community college will offer an 8-week incubator course/workshop and two colleges (including SRJC) will offer 4-week pre-incubator course/workshop. The entrepreneurs who successfully complete the incubator courses/workshops will qualify for a low-interest loan.

- a) 4-week incubator workshop: 90 minutes and 30 minutes of office hours; scheduled for Tuesday 6-7:30 PM, Sep. 3rd, 10th, 17th & 24th
- b) 8-week incubator workshop: 90 minutes and 30 minutes of office hours; scheduled for Tuesday 6-7:30 PM, Oct1-Dec. 3rd

In addition to the responsibilities related to the weekly pre-Incubator and incubator workshops, the faculty will also have other responsibilities associated to this program:

- a) Review workbook
- b) Provide feedback on Business Model Framework
- c) Meetings:
 - Weekly Check-in with the Community Manager: 30 minutes
 - Weekly Check-in with ESO: 60 minutes
 - Monthly EEE All Hands Meetings: 60 minutes
- d) Attend instructor orientation and periodic operations meetings
