






## INCOME GAP WIDENING Impacts Revenue



## CORPORATE TAX HAS BEEN CUT By Nearly Half Since 1981




## FISCAL INSTABILITY Seven Deficits In Ten Years



# BUDGET IN CRISES Current Year Budget is \$84.6 billion

- √ February 2009 Budget closed \$41.7 B deficit
- ✓ July 2009 Budget closed \$24.2 B deficit
  - \$30.5 B in expenditure reductions.
  - \$12.5 B in new taxes.
  - \$7.8 B of federal stimulus revenue
  - \$7.6 B in borrowing.
  - \$1.5 B in Governor's vetoes
  - \$3.4 B in revenue increases + enhancements
  - \$2.4 B in fund shifts and other solutions
- ✓ State paid bills with IOU's and stop critical state projects

# HOW DID WE GET HERE? General Fund Spending Growth

- ✓ \$45.8 Billion in Total Growth
  - > \$31.2 B of total growth due to inflation and population growth.
    - Population growth 16.8% since 1998 (5,490,616 people)
    - Inflation has been 37.2% over the decade

- ✓ Locked In Spending
  - Unfunded ballot box spending
  - \$6 billion to backfill Vehicle License Fee reduction

# HOW DID WE GET HERE? Other Factors Driving Spending Increases

- ✓ 7.8% more kids in school than ten years ago—number of children growing faster than general population growth
- ✓ Autism diagnosis up 1,342% between 1992 and 2006
- Baby boom aging drives up health care costs



- \$435 per child enrolled in Healthy Families.
- √ \$1,408 per participant enrolled in CalWORKS
- \$3,721 per student enrolled in community college
- \$5,707 per child in our foster care system
- √ \$6,612 per student enrolled at CSU
- √ \$7,806 per child in K-12 education
- √ \$12,756 per student enrolled in UC
- √ \$46,000 per prison inmate
- √ \$248,000 per incarcerated youth

- ✓ Corrections has increased by 8.5% annually over last decade (\$5.4 billion)

- Higher Education
- ✓ UC and CSU funding increased by 2.6 % annually over ten years (inflation was 3.2%)
